#### The Role of the Parish Council in the Planning Process

Salhouse Parish Council is consulted by Broadland District Council in respect to all planning applications in the Parish of Salhouse.

Parish Councils are statutory consultees and have no powers to approve or reject planning applications, they can submit one of three observations: **No Objections**, **Support** or **Object**. Support and Object must also have reasons given.

Any views expressed by the Parish Council will be taken into account by Broadland District Council before their decision is made, providing the points made are relevant to the determination of a planning application. The decision is typically made by a Broadland District Council Planning Officer acting under delegated powers of the Council. Complex and controversial applications may be decided by a delegated Committee of District Councillors.

The process is exactly the same as that of an individual wishing to comment on a planning application.

#### North Rackheath Development (GT16 - PA 20220663) Consultation

A report and results of the **green spaces survey** (which was sent to every household in Salhouse) is included on the following pages of this SAGA.

At the end of September a public consultation was also held by Taylor Wimpey in

the Jubilee Hall for this development and saw around 75 people attend the event. It is hoped a further consultation will be put on for those who were not able to go before the revised Masterplan is submitted to the Planning Authority later in November.

The Parish Council would urge everyone to look at this application and submit any comments to the District Council as although named 'North Rackheath' it will see a number of houses built and green spaces within the Parish of Salhouse along with Parish road closures.

Please keep an eye on the PC website, Facebook page and notice board where further information will be available once received.

Salhouse Parish is set to change once this development is under way, including the volume of traffic expected to increase through the village. Wroxham and Rackheath are already very busy as is traffic trying to cross the NDR (Broadland Northway), and Salhouse is one of very limited options for people trying to get to and from Norwich. The closure of local roads is only going to make our parish even busier.

#### Speeding

At the end of September representatives attended the local **Police Priority Setting Meeting**. Priorities for the Parish were speeding and parking issues within the village, which the Police will continue to monitor.

Data collected from the **SAM2 devices** (speed indicator device with slow down) are available on the Parish Council website. These devices are placed at different times and places around the Parish and collect data on the number of vehicles and their speed and often show a high number of vehicles exceeding the speed limit – this information is shared with the Police.

We are also fortunate to have a number of volunteers as part of a 'Community Speedwatch Team'. Speedwatch activity is a proactive solution to improve the safety and quality of life for everyone in the local community by educating drivers by displaying their speed with a view to improving driver behaviour.

**Highways Working Group**: Salhouse Parish Council has set up a 'Highways Working Group' to work with all stakeholders to find a way to make all our roads safer for everyone; the recent sad fatality in the Parish shows there's plenty of work to be done. If anyone wishes to join the working group please contact the Clerk.

#### Salhouse Neighbourhood Plan Review

What is a Neighbourhood Plan? - Neighbourhood Plans were introduced by the Localism Act 2011. They enable communities to have a say about the development and growth of their local area by introducing local planning

policies which (if the Neighbourhood Plan is successful at examination and referendum) form part of the statutory Development Plan. This means the Neighbourhood Plan must be taken into account when assessing planning applications for new development in that area.

Salhouse Parish adopted its current Neighbourhood Plan in July 2017 following a referendum. It is now due for a review before its expiry in July 2026. This can be a lengthy process and therefore as a community document the Parish Council is seeking volunteers to assist with this review. **As residents you know the Parish** 

**best.** If you would like to be part of this group

please contact the Parish Clerk.

#### North Rackheath Development (GT16) Working Group

Firstly, a huge thanks to everyone that took the time to provide feedback on what they would like to see in the green space that has been allocated to the above development, as per the Questionnaire that was delivered via the July 2023 SAGA. There were 78 responses (76 returned questionnaires via the self-addressed envelope, 1 received via email to the Clerk and 1 via Facebook) which equates to a circa 11% response rate of Salhouse residential households. Below are the results:



#### Other comments received:

- One person said the area needs to be designed by a landscape architect team with experience in public space design.
- Quite a few other comments were also received which were not directly in the remit of the questionnaire. For example, the raising of access issues involving Station Road, the provision of Doctors, Dentists, schools and shops etc. NOTE: this will be covered under a separate consultation exercise and ultimately it will be Highways that decide on the access to the development.
- Five people did not want any development at all.
- One person said the development to go ahead but with no loss of green space.

#### North Rackheath Development (GT16) Working Group



#### **Next Steps:**

This feedback has been provided to Broadland/South Norfolk Council, Rackheath Parish Council and to Taylor Wimpey to factor into their plans.

There was a Taylor Wimpey consultation day in Salhouse on 30<sup>th</sup> September to discuss the wider development including access. We are aware that the publicity and invitations to that event were delayed and a number of residents (both Salhouse and Rackheath) were not aware of that day or received the invitation too late to attend. SPC has requested that Taylor Wimpey run another full consultation day.

The Salhouse Parish Council North Rackheath Development (GT16) Working Group will continue to keep residents up to date via the SAGA, our Facebook page, website page and poster boards.

#### Salhouse Rovers Under 8's



#### SALHOUSE HISTORY



This old postcard has recently come to light. It shows the pond at Bell Corner looking from Hall Drive, but the caption says "Church Lane Corner, Salhouse". However, no matter how far back you go, there is no record of a Church Lane in Salhouse. Was Bell Lane known by another name at one time, or did the photographer not know what it was called, and just made a guess?



The postmark shows it was posted in Salhouse on Christmas Eve 1907 to Miss Ethel Wright at Salhouse Hall. A member of the staff, perhaps? Seeing as the Post Office in those days was in the house now known as Brooksbank, the card would have travelled barely half a mile to its destination.

#### An occasional update from Hoveton & Wroxham Medical Centre

#### **Under New Management**

We have begun work to analyse how our patients access general practice and to identify measures that might improve this access. We are looking at practical improvements to our telephony system that, for example, may prioritise our more vulnerable patients or their carers. We are reviewing the balance of demand against capacity to provide the evidence to recruit more staff and have increased the number of GP and Nurse Practitioner appointments. feedback your ideas.

#### **Carer Friendly Practice**

Hoveton & Wroxham Medical Centre is a carer friendly practice and we have sought recognition of this through Caring Together and Carers Matter Norfolk. A carer is someone who provides care for someone else who, due to illness, mental health problems, substance misuse, physical and learning disability, old age or frailty, is unable to fully care for themselves without a carers support. The first step is patients informing us that that are a carer.

**Practical Measures for Carers:** We can offer practical support such as priority access, double appointments, more convenient appointment times, follow-ups, and signposting to additional support.



#### Accessible Information Standard

The Accessible Information Standard aims to make sure that people who have a disability, impairment or sensory loss get information that they can access and understand, and any communication support that they need from health and care services. If you have any information or communication needs, please do tell us at Hoveton & Wroxham Medical Centre.

#### Referrals

Patients should always contact their consultant secretary if they are concerned that their clinical condition has changed or worsened since they were last seen at the hospital, or if they have questions about how long they are likely to wait. You should not ask the Practice as Reception or your GP won't know how long it will be.

#### **Dear Friends**





This November the geraniums and antirrhinums will be replaced with winter pansies and polyanthus in the beds around the village.


At the roundabout, we hope to be planting some perennial plants which will need less attention once established.

### Looking after Wildlife during Winter

Once the clocks go back and the nights are drawing in, you may think your garden can be ignored until spring. However, it is still a valuable living space for many different types of wildlife.





- Set up a compost heap, but be careful when you turn it. As these are often warm, they can be the winter resort of frogs or toads.
- Make or buy a hedgehog house. Put it in a quiet shady spot, with some dry leaves inside, as a fine winter residence.
- Provide a shallow dish or container of water at ground level. This
  will benefit other garden wildlife that needs to drink, as well as
  birds. Keep changing the water, especially during icy spells.
- Make an insect or bug hotel and put up in a sheltered position.
   Overwintering ladybirds and lacewings will find this useful.
- In late winter, clean out bird boxes so they are ready for new nests in spring the perfect spring clean!
- Leave healthy herbaceous and hollow-stemmed plants unpruned until early spring. These can provide homes for overwintering insects. Verbena Bonariensis and Sunflower heads are a valuable source of seeds for birds, especially finches.
- Put out food for birds and other wildlife such as squirrels. Birds like
  energy intensive foods like Nyjer seeds, millet, oats, and sunflower
  seeds. For squirrels you can offer extras such as hazelnuts, walnuts
  and almonds, or some chopped apple, beans, carrots or spinach.

As well as places to live, our gardens can be a great food source with plants that offer berries, pollen and nectar.

The best way to create habitats and food sources is to grow lots of different plants; try to include trees and hedges along with flowers, and

leave undisturbed corners. Plants to try include, Cotoneaster, Callicarpa, Spindle, Pyracantha or Viburnums. As well as autumn fruits, their flowers are great nectar source for insects and bees.

Holly & Ivy are not just for Christmas. Ivy's nectar-rich, greenish-yellow flowers, followed by black berries offer a great winter home for many different insects. Holly's red berries appear on female plants and are an excellent winter food for hungry birds.

Putting in a pond is another great way to attract wildlife. Your pond needn't be big. A washing-up bowl, a large plant pot, or a disused sink could all be repurposed as ponds. Just make sure any creatures can get in and out. Autumn and winter are the best times to make a pond – they will then be ready for Spring action.



### Pat Gallanders 1946—2023

Patricia Ann Gallanders was born in Jerusalem in July 1946, where her father was serving in the Palestine Police and her mother was a teacher. Both her parents were born in Neath, South Wales. In 1948 the family moved to Kenya where her dad was in the Colonial Service. Pat attended Kenya Girls High School in Nairobi.



Pat moved to England in 1963 as a boarder at Sherborne School for Girls in Dorset to study for her A levels. In 1965 she joined the RAF as an officer. During her long career, her posts included: Aircraft Controller; Station Commander at Portreath Cornwall; Falklands Senior Executive; Commander of a Specialist Training School; Briefing Officer Senior Management in Public Relations.

She served for 30 years, rising to the rank of Wing Commander. At one time in her career she was the most senior woman on active service in the RAF.

Her final posting before retirement was to RAF Neatishead, which brought her to live in Salhouse, with her parents, in 1994. On retirement she became Deputy Director of Appeals at the RAF Benevolent Fund.

Having moved to Salhouse, Pat became involved in numerous village activities and became a member of the Parish Council, where she put her admirable admin skills to good use. She coordinated the compilation of the 'Parish Plan' in 2008, which helped bring about a number of improvements to the village. She founded 'Team Salhouse' and the 'Afternoon Tea and Mardle', both of which continue to this day.

After both her parents had passed away, Pat moved to Pembrokeshire, South Wales in 2015, a place held dear in her heart.

She was passionate about animals, including her cats and particularly her beloved English border collie rescue dogs. She was also a generous supporter of many charities particularly animal and mental health charities.

Pat was a unique personality who had strong opinions that she wasn't afraid to share. She lead from the front; to many, she was a force to be reckoned with.

Pat died at home in Pembrokeshire in September, after a long illness. According to her wishes, she returned to Salhouse and was buried alongside her parents in the churchyard at All Saints' Church on October 16th 2023.

No one who knew Pat could forget her easily, she always made an impression and perhaps that is her greatest legacy.

Over the last 12 months, we have been barraged by a series of interest rate changes, casting enormous uncertainty onto the marketplace, and worrying first time buyers, investors, and in fact all home movers that mortgages will spiral out of control!

The decision on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> of November by the Bank of England to keep rates as they were for a 2<sup>nd</sup> successive rate decision is a very positive one, given prior to those two decisions we had seen 14 consecutive rate increases since November 2021.

I think the good news we have now to cling to, is that some mortgage deals are actually starting to look better again and that we may even be entering the period of consolidation. I for one would be delighted to see interest rates stabilise still further and at some point, in the future be reduced.

Since the whole interest rate changes started, we have seen house prices drop by between 5% and 10%, depending on how realistic that price was to start with.

If you have been watching the property market you will have noticed a serious uptick in price reductions and also a slowdown in new stock, as vendors and purchasers struggle to find true market value again.

Don't get me wrong, this all sounds like an enormous amount of doom and gloom, but properties are still actually selling. We've had a few properties lately where we have multiple bids and have had to resort to best and final offers which is always a sign that there is good activity out there in certain sectors of the market.



CHANGING HOUSE PRICES ACROSS THE REGION

The key to selling your home this quarter is sensible pricing and making sure you get the right purchaser.

The figures above are taken from the Rightmove price index which is produced each month and shows an average house price for the East Anglia region. This does include the Cambridge area which unfortunately increases our average house price somewhat, but for the purpose of this exercise, it does show you how prices have reacted to market conditions over the last 12 months.

I think the main takeaway on this graph is that prices have over the last 12 months dropped by at least 5%, depending upon how realistic the initial asking price of a property was when the interest rate changes started.

In the bigger picture of things, a 5% drop is really not that bad, as during the "Covid years" we were seeing 10% per year price increases which were completely unsustainable.

Ideally, we would like these figures to return to a 3 - 4% increase per year which will offer far more stability and consistency with pricing and lending. If you would like to dive deeper into price analysis, the full reports are available on the Rightmove website.

It is difficult to predict what will happen to the property market in the future. However, if interest rates stay level going forward this means that we may well see a brighter outlook and more stability for mortgage lending. This could mean that the market will have "turned a corner" and green shoots will start appearing and a brighter property market beckoning albeit some months ahead yet.

However, it is important to note that the property market is cyclical. This means that periods of boom are often followed by periods of decline such as we have seen over the past few months. Although generationally we have seen property values climb over the years despite these peaks and troughs.

Therefore, it is highly likely that with better mortgage deals and with further confirmation that rates have stabilised hopefully then the property market will start to show those signs of a further recovery through next year.



### EMERGENCY DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

In the event of a suspected heart attack / chest pains, the following procedure should be used:

- 1. Call 999 and ask for the Ambulance Service
- 2. Tell the Operator the telephone number from where you are calling, and they will tell you the location of the nearest Cabinet, as follows:



Jubilee Hall, Lower Street Salhouse NR13 6RE



The Green, Lower Street, Salhouse NR13 6RY



Station Road Salhouse NR13 6NX



The Recreation Ground Thieves Lane, Salhouse NR13 6RQ

- 3. The Operator will ask a series of questions which you need to answer to the best of your ability. This will only take a few seconds and will not delay the Ambulance.
- 4. THE OPERATOR WILL THEN PROVIDE YOU WITH THE ACCESS CODE TO OPEN THE CABINET
- 5. The Defibrillator and Resuscitation Pack should be removed from the cabinet and the Ambulance Service will stay on the line and give verbal assistance if required.
- 6. Switch on the Defibrillator and IT WILL GIVE YOU VERBAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE.
- 7. The Defibrillator cannot be used incorrectly as it will only deliver a shock to the patient if it detects it is necessary.
- 8. There are scissors in the Resuscitation Pack to assist with the removal of clothing and a pocket rescue breath mask to carry out CPR.

### **REMEMBER – Think SAFETY**

Before pushing the button, make sure everyone is clear and shout:

"STAND CLEAR - SHOCKING"

### Speedwatch Seeks Volunteers
